As we begin another program year, I write with renewed vigor to thank you for and tell you about the good work you help us do in our local community. Without YOU, our supporters, *nothing* could be done at A Stepping Stone. As most of you are aware, our three programs are funded entirely from your donations, grants and in-kind gifts.

This past program year (2012-2013), A Stepping Stone served a total of 38 families (77 individuals) with preschool, adult education, parenting and home visiting during the entire school year. See scholarship count to the right.

A BIG thank you goes out to the group of Thunderbird School of Global Management MBA candidates who, as part of a change project, helped us move forward toward a real change. See their picture above.

One short-term victory of that change project was that we have many recent test scores of former Stepping Stone Foundation students who are currently enrolled in elementary school (K-3) in the Alhambra School District. These results show a clear advantage to students who attend our program (six months or more)

• Eighty-five percent of our parents in ESL moved up one or more levels in English. At the time this went to press, two of our parents tested ready to take their GED exams.

• Awarded 26 Billie Gannaway Scholarships to former preschoolers wishing to attend post-secondary education.

• Hired two former preschoolers who worked part-time as paid interns to build work experience.

We have a few very exciting opportunities before us. We have been in conversation with the good folks in Gila County about bringing our preschool plus family literacy to areas of high need in the Miami-Globe area. More on the blog!

Important Medicare Information

Individuals who are eligible for or are currently on Medicare **AND** Medicaid (in Arizona AHCCCS) may qualify for additional financial aid that they may not be aware of. Based on income levels, programs are available to help pay Part B premiums and Part D prescription drug co-pays.

There are also additional benefits offered by different insurance companies that are not covered by Medicare but are of significant value to people who need some dental, vision and hearing insurance. Medicare does not provide coverage in these three areas, but some coverage is provided under the different plans offered by the carriers. The standard Medicare coverage is the same regardless of the insurance company. It is up to the individual to choose which plan best suits their needs.

These are all Medicare Advantage plans available to all individuals who have or are eligible for Part A **AND** have Part B coverage. They are offered at no cost to those who qualify. Those who are Medicare and Medicaid may qualify for additional financial aid based on income levels as mentioned above.

Those on Medicare and Medicaid may switch their plan at any time during the year. First time enrollees to Medicare may choose a plan up to 90 days before turning 65. Those individuals who are current Medicare recipients and do not fall under the conditions above may only change programs during the Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) from October 15th through December 7th.
