Another year has begun with 31 families participating in our program at Westwood Elementary in the Alhambra School district and 15 families participating in our new program at Bret Tarver Isaac Preschool in the Isaac School District. Both programs have upcoming field trips with our Westwood families attending the Pumpkin Patch at the Desert Botanical Gardens and our Bret Tarver students visiting the Musical Instrument Museum. Other field trips are planned throughout the school year.

Our Westwood parents have begun their adult education classes with Lakshmi Bourne from Literacy Volunteers of Maricopa County. In addition to our teacher-facilitated parenting classes, Raising a Reader and Kith and Kin are scheduled for later in the year. The funding for these programs is provided by First Things First. Our Isaac parents been participating in parenting classes provided by Creciendo Unidos. Our childcare staff at both sites provide a nurturing program with age appropriate activities for younger siblings while our preschoolers and their parents are in their respective classes.

Our preschool teaching teams provide activities for our students with the goal of developing those skills which prepare them for a successful transition to kindergarten. With daily lessons based on state preschool standards and the developmental needs of the students in their class rooms, the children are busy exploring the many learning centers provided both inside and outside. 


INTRODUCING: Sue Tormala, Development Consultant

Fifteen months ago, I was introduced to A Stepping Stone Foundation (SSF) when they were looking for a fundraising consultant to help them with grantwriting. I was immediately intrigued, particularly because I had been "retired" for three years, after losing my adult son, who had been an elementary school music teacher in PESD#1 for eight years, where Spanish fluency was a job requirement. Imagine impacting the lives of the same population he had!

I believe that inspiration is the key to success. I have been inspired by many, including my son. In this work, I knew I would be honoring his life and bring more meaning to mine.

For the second year in a row, Avnet employees in the Phoenix area were able to brighten their coworkers' days while raising money to support A Stepping Stone Foundation.
