We at A Stepping Stone Foundation hope that this newsletter finds you and your loved ones in good health. Our country is going through unprecedented times, but let us remember that together we can rise above all challenges. Our children and their families continue to be blessed because of the kindness and empathy you have shown and afforded them through stepping stones such as our Literacy Elevates Arizona Families (LEAF) program so that they may actualize a life of liberty toward the pursuit of happiness. Together we support the lifelong success for both our students and their families in any capacity that we can assist them.

#### WHAT YOU HELP US ACHIEVE

Even though COVID19 interrupted our typical LEAF (Literacy Elevates Arizona Families) services in March, we were still able to serve 46 families across our two sites last year. Of those families, 32 were in the program 6 months or longer. By mid-March, each preschooler had attended at least 465 hours of preschool with one of our highly qualified, certificated lead teachers and her highly qualified assistant. All

preschoolers enrolled in our program six months or more were on track to meet their Teaching Strategies Gold benchmarks, but all classroom observation ceased on March 17th. Each parent had participated in their adult education (ESL or HSE), parenting classes and home visiting at an 80% attendance rate or better. LEAF and all our programs continue this fall through remote services such as Zoom, Google Classroom and WebEx.

#### OUR EXPANDING SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

One of the unique features of ASSF's family literacy programs is the promise of a college scholarship for every child enrolled six months or more in one of our LEAF programs. In the fall of 2019, we began a new scholarship celebrating founder Rev. William O. Smith. The first two William O. Smith Scholarship (WOSS) continued on p. 2

# From HeckmanEquation.org The Economics of Human Potential

Professor Heckman's newest research looks at the life outcomes of Perry Preschool participants at midlife, as well as outcomes of their children. After putting the data through a series of rigorous tests, Heckman finds that those children who participated in the Perry Preschool program had significant gains in personal and family life outcomes that provided their children with positive multi-generation effects on education, health, employment and civic life. Early childhood education resulted in stronger families and significantly contributed to upward mobility in the next generation—an indication that early childhood education can be an effective way to break the cycle of poverty.



James Joseph Heckman is a Nobel Prize winning American economist who is currently at the University of Chicago, where he is The Henry Schultz Distinguished Service Professor in Economics...among many other duties and honors!
